

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT MARCH 4, 2020

ADMINISTRATION

• I am moving forward with signing on with the State to offer a municipal forms program. This will allow residents to file forms, permits, etc. online without having to come to the office. There will also be a method for online payment. The timing for resident roll-out is to be determined.

AIRPORT

• We gave an initial approval on the 95% plans for taxilane reconstruction between the 100 and 200 hangar blocks at the airport. This will allow Gale to proceed with bidding and securing the grant funding.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

 We've received another potential rendering to be paired with our Community Revitalization Plan. Wright-Pierce is working to provide us with a strong draft for committee review.

FINANCE

• January's Waste Management Host Benefit check was received. Under the terms of the new agreement, we received \$56,510.77. Under terms of the old agreement, we would have received \$33,871.57—a favorable difference of \$22,639.20 (67%). The value captured in revenue generating cover alone accounted for nearly \$6,700 in one month.

FIRE/EMA

• The positions for full-time firefighters have not been finalized; they have not been posted for hiring. Applicants are encouraged to wait to apply until the positions are advertised. The Chief and other officers will not be addressing inquiries.

LIBRARIES

• There was a three-day book sale that raised nearly \$500 for the library. Left over books have been sent to the Grange; the VI will try and sell the balance of these books with their spring plant sale.

SEWER

- Work will be suspended as a part of the upgrade, beginning March 6, for approximately 38 days. This will provide cost-savings to both parties.
- Beginning this week, we are cleaning the second aeration tank in preparation for the second phase of the upgrade. We sought prices from ACV and Ted Berry; Ted Berry was the lowest price offering a rate of \$3,600 per day, up to \$18,000. The Sewer Commissioners have accepted this proposal. To save incremental transportation costs, we will be hauling the waste to AMSD.

RECREATION

- We are looking to get the Recreation Committee together within the next couple of weeks in order to discuss how to proceed with construction at the ballfield.
- We were notified that Cal Ripken fees were increasing to \$70 per play in Skowhegan; we will be reviewing previous years' costs and discussion how to move forward.
