Honoring Our Fallen Deputy & Neighbor: Corporal Eugene Cole Memorial Bridge

Dedication to be held October 7, 2018 at 2:00 p.m.

April 25, 2018, is a day that has forever changed Norridgewock. The events of that day marked an end to one man's life, yet reaffirmed a commitment, respect, and appreciation for law enforcement. The thin blue line has become part of what we are.

Corporal Eugene Cole of the Somerset County Sheriff's Office was a longtime resident of Norridgewock and worked daily to serve and protect his hometown. Widely noted were Gene's unique ability to bridge gaps and his remarkable talent of community policing. Cole cared for his community and the people in it.

In the wake of this senseless tragedy, the community showed its true grit, loyalty to law enforcement, and our ability to join together as a region and stand united. State Representative Brad Farrin proposed LD 1914 and was joined by co-sponsor and Norridgewock-native and State Senator Nathan Libby to rename the bridge spanning the Kennebec River, Corporal Eugene Cole Memorial Bridge. Governor Paul LePage signed the bill into law recently, joined by family, friends, co-workers, officials, and legislators.

The Town is working cooperatively with groups across the region to organize a bridge dedication ceremony for Sunday, October 7. This date is especially important, as Gene would have celebrated his 62nd birthday. More information will become available as the event draws closer—information will be available on the Town of Norridgewock's Facebook, webpage, as well as in the media and posted throughout the Town. ◆

Library Expands Summer Programming

Have fun learning—new programs for all ages!

Have you noticed all of the events hosted by the Norridgewock Library this summer? We sure have! The Library Board of Trustees has been working diligently to bring new opportunities to the community and expand offerings at the library.

Recently, several Norridgewock firefighters volunteered their Saturday morning to show dozens of children about firefighting and the fire equipment. It was an opportunity for children to learn more about their work while gaining access to a variety of literature about firefighting and emergency services. The event drew a very enthusiastic group of young people (mostly 6 and under with an array of parents and grandparents). As it was a very muggy day, one of the highlights of the visit for each child was the hands-on instruction for handling the various hoses used by the fire department. For some, this also included running through the spray and big puddles with glee. One guest brought a wonderful black lab puppy, which added a lot to the fun, too!

Coming up on August 18, the library will host the **Maine State Police K-9 unit**. Again, this program will be an opportunity for families to learn in a more active environment about a unique aspect of law enforcement. Bring your family to see "Bella" the K-9 officer.

September 29 at 11:00 a.m. the Mercer Road library will host the Chewonki program **Owls of Maine**. The Chewonki Foundation conducts several nature programs and the library trustees are looking to share the experience in Norridgewock. This will be a great opportunity to see live owls up close!

Ongoing this summer is a **children's reading program-** *Read to Win*. Children (pre-K to grade 6) visit the library this summer and check out books. When you visit the library, you'll receive a ticket to enter the monthly drawing (August 25), as well as automatic entry into the grand prize drawing (drawn at Oosoola Days on September 3). Voting to Return to School Gym

In June, an alternate voting place was considered; however, the Grange does not fully meet the needs of a larger election. To avoid having to constantly relocate voting places, the Town Clerk has requested authorization from the Secretary of State to return voting to Mill Stream Elementary School. A request has also been made to the Superintendent of Schools to consider rescheduling an in-service day to allow for use of the building with lesser threat to safety.

With larger elections, voter turnout can easily exceed 1,500 voters, which requires a more substantial space (for perspective, only 562 voters participated in June's election at the grange). We are required to maintain certain square footage requirements, as well as a certain number of voting booths. A high turnout is expected in November and it is essential that the voting place be adequate.

We wish to extend thanks to the Somerset Grange and its membership for welcoming us to use the facility as a trial voting place and we appreciate their work in preparing the building for our use. •
